1. Items for Discussion:

a. NFRC 600 DEFINITIONS:

i. Existing:

1. **Label:** permanent and/or temporary marker or device applied to a fenestration product, listing rating information, and indicating compliance with certification requirements.
2. **Label Certificate:** A document used in lieu of an NFRC Temporary Label specific to certain products that have received certification authorization. See NFRC 705.

ii. New:

1. **Fenestration Manufacturer Certificate:** A document, for one specific project location, that lists multiple products which have received certification authorization, and used in conjunction with permanent labels on each product listed and in lieu of NFRC temporary labels. See NFRC 700.

iii. Revised:

1. **Certification Authorization Report, CAR:** Certificate listing performance values of NFRC-rated products that is issued by an NFRC-Licensed IA granting the licensee the authority to affix NFRC Labels on a fenestration product or on the box/packaging containing an attachment product, **or generate a FMC**, or to obtain an NFRC Label Certificate, upon PCP compliance by the licensee.
2. **Label Certificate:** A document used in lieu of an NFRC Temporary Label specific to certain products that have received certification authorization. See NFRC **700 and 705**.

b. Fenestration Manufacturer Certificate (FMC)

i. See updated FMC Ballot –<http://www.nfrc.org/PCPReviewTaskGroup.aspx>

1. FMC layout for approval (version 1 or version 2)
2. Removal of 6.6.3 “Label Certificate for Fenestration Manufacturers” (non-site-built).
 - a. The allowance for a manufacturer to use the Site-Built certificate in lieu of a temporary label on each project is covered by the FMC.

- i. The FMC is not replacing the Site-Built License Certificate. (see our ballot section 6.6.4.A: The FMC

cannot be used for Site-Built Products or CMA certification)

3. Andersen – addition of language to clarify non-certified products cannot have logo or disclaimer. See Section 6.1.B and figure B-1B.
 4. Andersen – addition of language to clarify re-printing of labels. See section 6.4.D.
 5. Review Mandatory Information in section 6.6.4.D.
- c. “Do Not Remove”
- i. A PCP bulletin will be distributed to recommend manufacturers place a “Do Not Remove” info around the label but it can’t be inside the NFRC Label block.
- d. Metric Labeling Language
- i. J.Baker to provide excel spreadsheet for SI/IP conversion to PCP Review TG that shows the proof of the need of two (2) decimal places.

2. Pending Business:

- a. Private Labeler / Manufacturer (Parent/Child) relationships
 - i. B. Shultz to provide instances where the PL copy of the manufacturer’s product line would not be suspended.
- b. French Label:
 - i. Need to set a sunset date to use old labels. 6 months upon publication and implementation.
